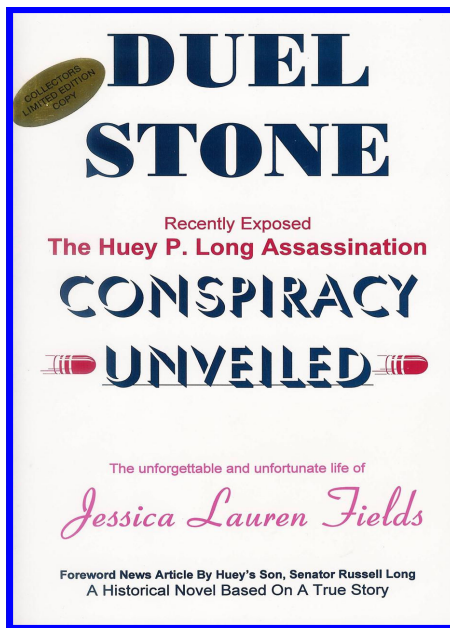

*Conspiracy Unveiled: The Huey P. Long Assassination* is a fascinating addition to the lore surrounding this subject. Although, for years, the shooting of "the Kingfish"—Louisiana's populist Sen. Huey P. Long—on September 8, 1935 has been the subject of controversy, Duel Stone's new book provides a fascinating look at a little-known aspect of the story, one that has never before been told.

Stone's book outlines in novelized form the sad story of Jessica Lauren Fields, a young lady from Louisiana—a staunch supporter of Long's—who had the misfortune of hearing a portion of the assassination conspiracy being launched. When the intrepid young lady first suspected that plans were afoot to kill the Kingfish, she didn't turn her head and run in the opposite direction. Instead, she continued to move in the conspirators' circles and listen in on their plans. Although Jessica made several attempts to alert Long to the threat, the die had been cast and the plans came full circle.

Then, after Long was killed, Jessica was taken away from her family—without notice—and railroaded by a judge, in league with the conspirators, who found her mentally incompetent

and a danger to society (that is, to the attempts to cover up the truth about who killed Long—and why). Not only did the judge sentence Jessica to incarceration in a mental institution, but he arranged for her to be shipped out of state and into Washington, D.C.'s infamous St. Elizabeth's hospital for the criminally insane.

Repeated attempts by Jessica and her family to gain her release failed until 53 years later when the aging woman was released to the care of a Louisiana nursing home. But it wasn't until well after Jessica's death in 1988 that Duel Stone decided to tell her story.

Although the author never knew his aunt, her pathetic story was passed down to him from family members who knew the sad tale and now, in an attempt to get her story out for the first time, Stone has crafted a well-written and rather bittersweet tale of the life and untimely fate of his Aunt Jessica.

## NAMES HIDDEN

The author has chosen to mask the real name of his aunt and the family—and those she named as participants in the conspiracy—but we can certainly understand why. The Louisiana in which Jessica Lauren Fields was taken captive and sent into exile by the authorities has not changed much in the six decades that have passed since the plutocratic elite of that state (in alliance with the plutocrats at the national level) dispatched Huey Long into the great hereafter.

The irony is that although Huey Long's critics were quick and loud to proclaim the Kingfish as being a corrupt tyrant, the fate of Jessica Lauren Fields show precisely who the real corrupt tyrants truly were—and it is not a pleasant truth to be told.

Although this is Stone's first book, the author has successfully captured a real slice of Americana: the life and times of the average American—the kind of hard-working people who rallied behind Huey P. Long during the darkest days of our nation's his-

tory. Unfortunately, Stone's book also tells the dark tale of how one Long supporter paid the price for her devotion. And that, perhaps, is what makes the book most valuable.

*Conspiracy Unveiled* demonstrates how an innocent bystander—privity to the intrigues of the power elite—can be abused by a legal system run amok when the power of law falls into the hands of those with crime on their minds.

Today, America's prisons—and mental institutions—are filled with otherwise law-abiding Americans (and others who may have skirted the law in some way or another), and who have been incarcerated for the sole reason that they ran afoul of those in power.
